650.02**Basic Listing Interchange File (BLIF)****1. Service Description**

Basic Listing Interchange File (BLIF) service provides Local Exchange Carriers (LECs) operating in Canada, Alternate Operator Service Providers (AOSPs) and Independent Telephone Directory Publishers with a machine-readable file containing non-confidential subscriber listing information (Listings) for SaskTel's subscribers listed, and intended to be listed, in SaskTel's directories and directory assistance databases. SaskTel will provide a complete set of subscriber listings, as specified in the BLIF Service Description and Ordering Guidelines document (BLIF Document), to LECs for the purpose of providing telephone directories and/or directory assistance services, to AOSPs solely for the purpose of providing directory assistance, and to Independent Telephone Directory Publishers solely for the purpose of compiling, producing, publishing and distributing independent telephone directories.

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**2. Definitions**

For the purposes of this Tariff Item:

*"Listings"* refer to subscriber listings, as described in the Listing Definitions section of the BLIF Document, which are included in SaskTel's BLIF.

*"BLIF Master"* refers to the provision of BLIF containing all of the Listings for an exchange or those exchanges agreed upon by SaskTel and the Licensee from time to time. The BLIF Master reflects subscriber listing information as of the last business day prior to the first full weekend of each month.

*"BLIF Updates"* refers to the provision of BLIF containing only updated Listings for an exchange, when compared to the BLIF Master for that exchange which the LEC has already received and for which the LEC has requested regular updates. That is, additions, deletions and revisions, resulting from service order activity affecting the BLIF Master and/or previous BLIF Updates. The BLIF Update File is available daily, weekly, bi-weekly or monthly depending on the frequency requested by the Licensee.

“*Licensee*” refers to a Local Exchange Carrier operating in Canada who wishes to obtain SaskTel’s subscriber listing information contained in SaskTel’s BLIF for the purpose of providing telephone directories and/or directory assistance services (the “*Services*”).

**3. Conditions of Service**

1. The Licensee must enter into a license agreement with SaskTel for a period of five (5) years, renewable automatically for five (5) year periods (the BLIF Agreement).
2. The Licensee shall not license, sub-license, share, sell, re-sell, rent, lease, charge, encumber, pledge or otherwise dispose of, deal with, use or copy SaskTel’s BLIF in favour of any person, save expressly permitted in this tariff and the BLIF Agreement. The Licensee agrees to take all necessary steps to protect and safeguard the Listings from unauthorized disclosure.
3. Listings are provided in a format conforming with the specifications set out in the BLIF Document.
4. The BLIF will include all of the required information as specified in the BLIF Document.
5. The Licensee may purchase Residential listings, Business/Government listings, or both.

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**3. Conditions of Service - Continued**

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6. The following list of various types of listing information identified below is not exhaustive and is not provided in BLIF:
  - (a) Non-Published Telephone Numbers;
  - (b) Non-Post Telephone Numbers. That is, business telephone numbers that do not go into the Directory to be published or into Directory Assistance.
  - (c) “Out of Book” listings. That is, those listings added to a particular directory when the terminating location of the number is not within the physical region of the directory’s coverage;
  - (d) 800, 877, 888, 310 and 900 listings;
  - (e) Reference listings;
  - (f) 9-1-1, 711, 611, 411, 0, 1;
  - (g) Public mobile listings;
  - (h) Additional/extra listings;
  - (i) Text accompanying listings (i.e. special instructions, Internet listings);
  - (j) Zenith
7. The Licensee shall comply with all specifications set out in the BLIF Document pertaining to the Licensee.
8. The limitations of liability provisions as set out in the BLIF Agreement, to be entered into by the Licensee and SaskTel, are hereby incorporated by reference into this Tariff.
9. The Licensee may terminate the BLIF Agreement at any time by giving written notice to SaskTel at least ninety (90) days in advance of the effective date of any such termination. SaskTel shall have the right to terminate the BLIF Agreement upon ten (10) days prior written notice if Licensee has breached any of its material obligations in the BLIF Agreement or this tariff, and Licensee has failed to cure such default within thirty (30) days of receipt of a written notice sent from SaskTel describing the nature of the default.

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**3. Conditions of Service - Continued**

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10. In the event of termination, any amounts due to SaskTel pursuant to the BLIF Agreement and this Tariff shall immediately become due and payable. In such event, Licensee shall immediately discontinue the use of Listings and comply with all other requirements set out in the BLIF Agreement.

11. BLIF is available on an exchange basis as listed in the item on Rate Group Classification.

**4. Rates**

The Customer shall pay to SaskTel the following rates and charges for Basic Listing Interchange File. Such rates and charges are in addition to any other rates and charges that may be applicable.

The following Master File rate may be payable coincident with the delivery of the BLIF Master as outlined in the BLIF Agreement. The following Update File rate is payable on a monthly basis.
