ITEM Public Telephone Service 110.18

1. Service Description

- 1. Public Telephone Service primarily involves the provision of outgoing message service from exchange telephone equipment supplied by SaskTel and at SaskTel's option for use by the general public. Public telephones are equipped with a coin-collecting device except when cardreader telephones are used to provide the service.
- 2. Messages, whether terminating within or outside the local calling area, may:
 - (a) be paid for at the time they are to be sent by:
 - i. depositing the appropriate coins in the coin collecting device attached to the Public Telephone Service equipment; or
 - ii. using an authorized prepaid cash card placed in the card reader of an appropriately equipped public telephone. SaskTel shall determine those public telephones which accept prepaid cash card transactions; or
 - iii. using a valid long distance prepaid phone card.
 - (b) be billed to a magnetic stripe calling card or commercial credit card, accepted by SaskTel, where the magnetic stripe calling card or commercial credit card has been read by the Public Telephone Service equipment, or
 - (c) be billed to a third party number, to a calling card, or as a collect call by accessing the operator through Public Telephone Service equipment.



2. Conditions of Service

- 1. Public Telephone Service shall be provided on Individual Lines only.
- 2. Public Telephone Service may be terminated at SaskTel's discretion.
- 3. When Public Telephone Service equipment is located on private property, SaskTel will negotiate with the owner of private property a reasonable amount of compensation for the space and facilities required for SaskTel to provide, install and maintain it's equipment.
- 4. Extension Service will not be provided with Public Telephone Service.
- 5. SaskTel shall deny the termination or completion of all incoming telephone calls placed to Public Telephone Service equipment, except in those circumstances where SaskTel decides or mutually agrees with the owner of the private property on which the Public Telephone Service is located that incoming telephone calls are of benefit to the user of the Public Telephone Service.
- 6. Public Telephone numbers are listed in telephone directories only if SaskTel considers it necessary for the public good or if no other service is available.

7. SaskTel will issue promotional pre-paid cash cards with a value of up to \$25.00. These cards may be distributed at events such as consumer exhibitions, trade shows, sporting events, or elsewhere. SaskTel intends to distribute the cards in a random fashion at each event or in each market segment where the promotion is aimed. At each event where promotional cards are distributed, SaskTel intends to give no more than one card per person. In addition, SaskTel may provide some sample cards to existing and potential pre-paid cash card retailers.

SaskTel may also introduce marketing initiatives such as where pre-paid cards may be provided at a discount below face value or, alternatively, the pre-paid card may have in excess of the face value on the card. SaskTel intends its marketing activities to impact broad segments of its target market.
